





County unemployment rates, not seasonally adjusted









Unemployment rates continue to fall through much of the US






But at the substate level, there is a different pattern emerging between urban and rural counties





Labor force growth has been strongest in the Seattle area





Labor force participation rates are highest in urban counties, lowest in rural counties







Labor force participation rate- Washington state counties - 16 years and older






Statewide, labor force participation varies demographically...



The population growth *rate* in King County is slowing...


Annual Population Growth, 1961 - 2019


Annual Population Change: Natural Increase and Net In-migration King County


Percent of Population by Age Group, 2018












King and Snohomish Counties are home to slightly more than ½ of Washington jobs






Seattle area job recovery led the state






Year over year, most states have seen job growth






Employment growth has been variable across the state








Average hourly wage, adjusted for inflation






Washington state has had the second highest rate of wage growth (average)








Average annual wage by industry: King County, 2018

Average Annual Wage by Industry, 2018, King County






Average annual wage by industry: Snohomish County, 2018






Average annual wage by industry: Pierce County, 2018






Statewide average annual employment growth will average 1.7%, 2017-2022






Computer-related occupations will grow the most on a percentage basis
